THE LITTLE CHURCH THAT COULD

Many churches have begun using the GPS Life Journey to help their members discover and engage in God's purposes for their lives. Here is one example of how the GPS has impacted a community and the world from the service of a congregation of one small church of less than 100 adults:

- Four men help repair a local Christian school building
- A woman leads a regular prayer walk at local elementary school
- A couple ministers in Belize for three weeks in slum region
- A woman leads an on-going prayer group for local high school
- A woman serves as a regular volunteer with a community benevolence organization
- Several men serve as watch dogs for local elementary school
- A couple serves two weeks at an orphanage in Tanzania
- A woman adopts and weekly ministers to retirement home residents who have no family
- A woman goes to India to teach ESL for two months
- A man goes to Philippines to minister to the poor for 6 months
- A woman goes to Tajikistan for three weeks to minister to missionaries
- A man regularly tutors children after school
- A man does outreach project in Southern Russia
- A man raises funds on an on-going basis for a foster home in Kenya
- A woman trains for full-time ministry in India
- Two men mobilize funding for Bible distributions globally

As a result of their participation in the GPS Life Journey, scores of people of all ages have discovered and engaged in God's purposes for their lives. They now experience significance and those they serve are eternally grateful.

GOD IS AT WORK WORLD-WIDE

AN INTERVIEW WITH KINGDOM MOBILIZATION'S GLOBAL DIRECTOR DOUG HODGE

George Gundlach, Kingdom Mobilization's Managing Director recently interviewed Global Director, Doug Hodge. They talked about how God is using the GPS Life Journey to impact the nations.

George: Did anything happen this year that you would never have imagined a year ago?

Doug: Yes, in February I was conducting a GPS Blitz in Washington, D.C. and one person in the group was a potential GPS Facilitator/Country Director who wanted to take the curriculum to China. I am presently training her to be a Certified Facilitator for that country. Right now we plan to hold our first GPS sessions in Beijing in March 2016. I will be on the ground to take her through the first two sessions. She has already made arrangements with a translator who is a believer and is translating GPS into Chinese.



George: I know you have been working in and around Russia for the last few years. What can you share about progress there?

Doug: GPS is already being utilized by several rehab facilities near Moscow. I will be heading to Ukraine in late October with a pastor of a Russian church located in Southwest Florida. Currently we have one church with 15 leaders to go through GPS in Kiev. We will take some of that group through Certified Facilitator Training so they can continue to help many more discover God's purposes for their lives. We will follow that with meetings in a neighboring city with city officials and university officials to discuss possibilities of bringing GPS to that city. We will also be training two Russians from Moscow. We will take them through Facilitator Training so they will be able to take the GPS Life Journey to the Moscow region.

George: You have had a major focus on Africa in recent years. How are things going there?

Doug: Our biggest growth in Africa has been in Nigeria. I will be there with our Nigeria Country Director, Ken Eze, before the end of the year. We will also be reaching out to pastors in Ghana who have shown interest. We will be training about 25 individuals there. After that we will do training in southern Nigeria with a leader named Pastor George and his group of 25 pastors. Hundreds have completed the GPS curriculum in Nigeria and are engaged in significant service in their communities.

George: As you look ahead to 2016 what further expansion are you anticipating?

Doug: In addition to strengthening our many world-wide connections, I am looking at a potential trip to India in early February to establish a new connection there with an expat in Northern India. I am hoping that that person can serve as our Country Director there. Also, our Houston Area Director, Jim Lieto, will be taking the GPS curriculum to Cuba as it is now translated into Spanish. I am sure God has a lot more on the agenda for 2016 that He will reveal in due time.
